According to the JCC's Serena Franks, Kligerman has been a member of the JCC for more than 20 years and is "incredibly active at the JCC."

"She attends most of our events and programs and supports our JCC," Franks said, noting that Kligerman is " the most youthful" for her age.

"I'm certainly involved in a lot of things here, so I guess everybody thinks I'm a little younger," Kligerman said.

Among activities for the large community of local seniors that are offered by the JCC in Margate, which it calls "Active Adult Programs," are martial arts, chair yoga, bridge, Tai Chi, and a crochet club. There are also several upcoming one-shot events, including a Mahjong & Canasta Brunch in December, a day trip to American Dream in the Meadowlands, and a Drag Diva Bingo, both in January.
